

The American Osteopathic College of Anesthesiologists (**AOCA**) is a national membership organization that promotes the interests of osteopathic anesthesiologists by improving the quality of training, education, and patient care as it relates to anesthesia and pain management.

- · Support the students/residents task force


Goal:


- Increase the annual AOCA profitability by 15%
