Regalia and Motto

The regalia worn by the Fellows of the College has its beginning in the revival of interest in learning that took place in Europe in the 11th and 12th centuries and in the history of academic costumes and regulations governing their design and wear. Each component of the regalia has its proper place and story to tell as has each color used.

We note that the colors used in the regalia and the insignia of the College are Red, Green and Golden-Yellow.

Red- stands for God and denotes Theology or Divinity. We use it to denote the Great Physician and Healer-God. It also symbolizes Blood-the life giving fluid.

Green-symbolic of life and growth-denotes medicine or osteopathy. Our responsibility for life give us the use of green.

Golden-Yellow represents light and denotes science. It is through the light of science that the physician seeks for greater knowledge in the care of the afflicted and sick.

Thus the colors used in the regalia and insignia constantly remind us that we are physicians dealing with life and seeking the light of more knowledge.

NISI DOMINUS FRUSTRA, the motto in the insignia freely translated is *unless the Lord is with us our efforts are in vain.*
